#### • Megapolis -the panacea for all ills?

#### • Sri Lanka mulls shifting coastal rail track inland

A plan to make Sri Lanka's capital Colombo into a 'megapolis' of 9 million people by 2040 has suggested shifting an existing coastal railway track to create valuable unobstructed beachfront has been proposed.

The structure plan proposed a feasibility study to divert the railway track from Panadura, South of Colombo to Colombo Fort railway station and reserving land for a possible shift of the track.

#### • Sri Lanka mulls closing Ratmalana airport

A plan to make Sri Lanka's capital Colombo into 'Megapolis' of nine million people has proposed developing a domestic airport in the city to serve budget carriers or converting the land into real estate development.

The airport in the Ratmalana suburb is used by the military, training schools and smaller private aircraft.

"The government has been contemplating to redevelop the airport into residential and commercial development as the airport is not optimally used and may not be viable in the long term," the structure plan for the mega city said.

## • MTD Walkers prepares for positive growth in construction industry

#### • Sri Lanka Megapolis plan downsizes China Port City

A structure plan to expand Sri Lanka's capital into a 'Megapolis' of nine million people by 2040 has proposed a sharp downsizing of a 'port city' to reclaimed out of the sea by Chinese state firm.

A concept plan for the Megapolis developed with Singapore's Surbana Jurong has proposed a 90 hectare city with a marina instead of a 200 plus hectare reclamation protected by a breakwater originally proposed.

#### • Sri Lanka's second biggest city to get new sewerage plant

Construction work begins on February 19 on a Japanese-funded waste water treatment facility for Sri Lanka's second biggest city, the hill country town of Kandy, which would also improve water quality in its main river.

Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) said it is financing for the project under a highly concessional loan of 14,087 million yen (16.9 billion rupees).

The project is being managed by Sri Lanka's National Water Supply and Drainage Board.

#### • Poverty in Sri Lanka down, revenue shortfall a concern: World Bank

Sri Lanka has reduced poverty to below 7 percent of the population but future prosperity will depend on addressing chronic revenue short falls and fostering a more competitive and inclusive economy, the World Bank said in research findings announced today.

"The Sri Lanka poverty assessment has found that the falling poverty stems mostly from increasing labour income as the economy has shifted from the less productive agriculture towards the industry and service sectors, more urbanization and rising domestic demand," a statement said.



# • Another economist warns against use of previous regime's statistics

Information brought to light by another leading economist recently highlighted the danger of the new regime running into hot waters by accepting the statistics and continuing the policies of the past regime.

Australian National University Economics Professor Prema-Chandra Athukorale said that the past government had used the fixed nominal exchange rate in calculating the per capita gross domestic product (GDP) instead of accounting for inflation and the real prices in the economy.
